Record number served

The number of individuals served at FFY has more than doubled in the last 5 years. Intentional meetings with those we served are up another 6% this year over last. Stop in the Club any afternoon. Where you'd have found 130 playful kids two years ago, you'll now find closer to 200 smiling faces.

In 2016 the FFY Board approved an additional \$30,000 in 100% scholarships to reach these youth.

BGCA Gateway to Impact Award

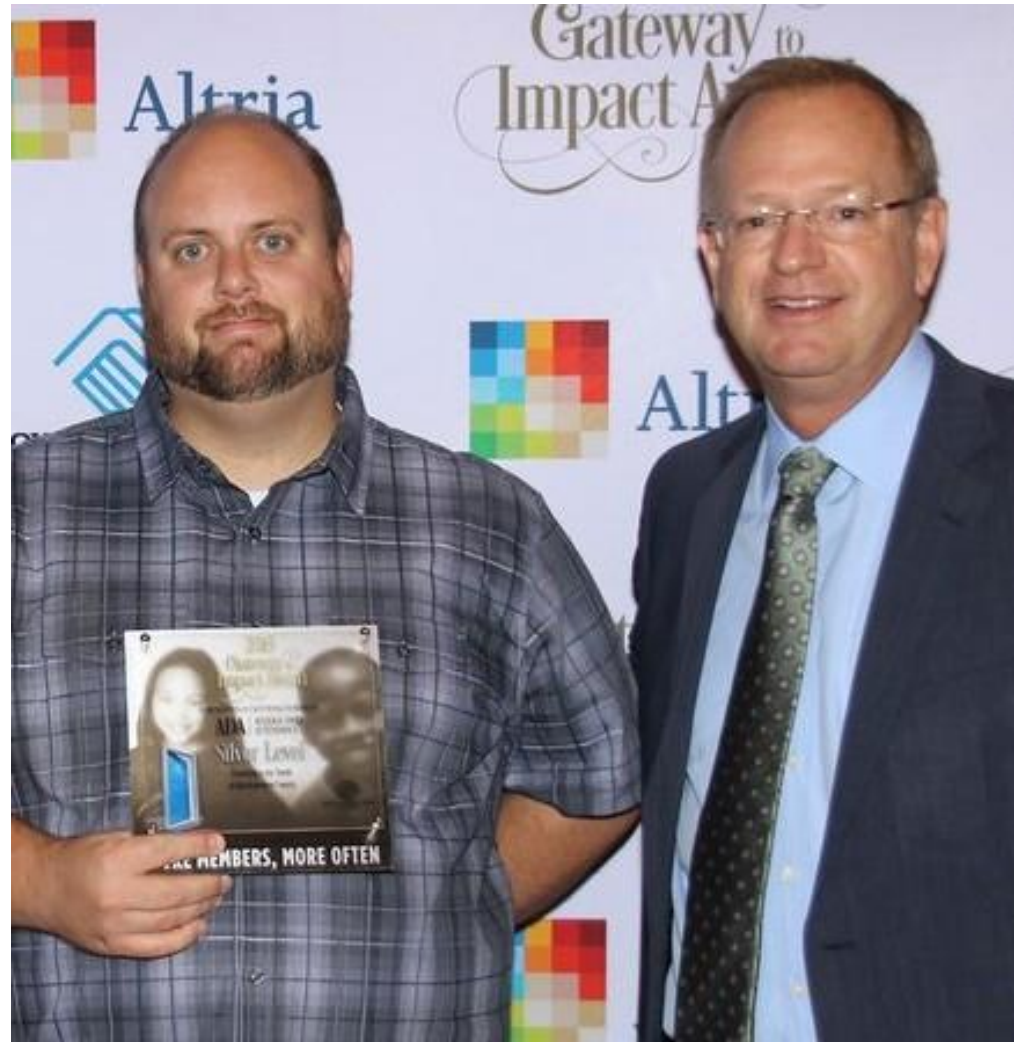

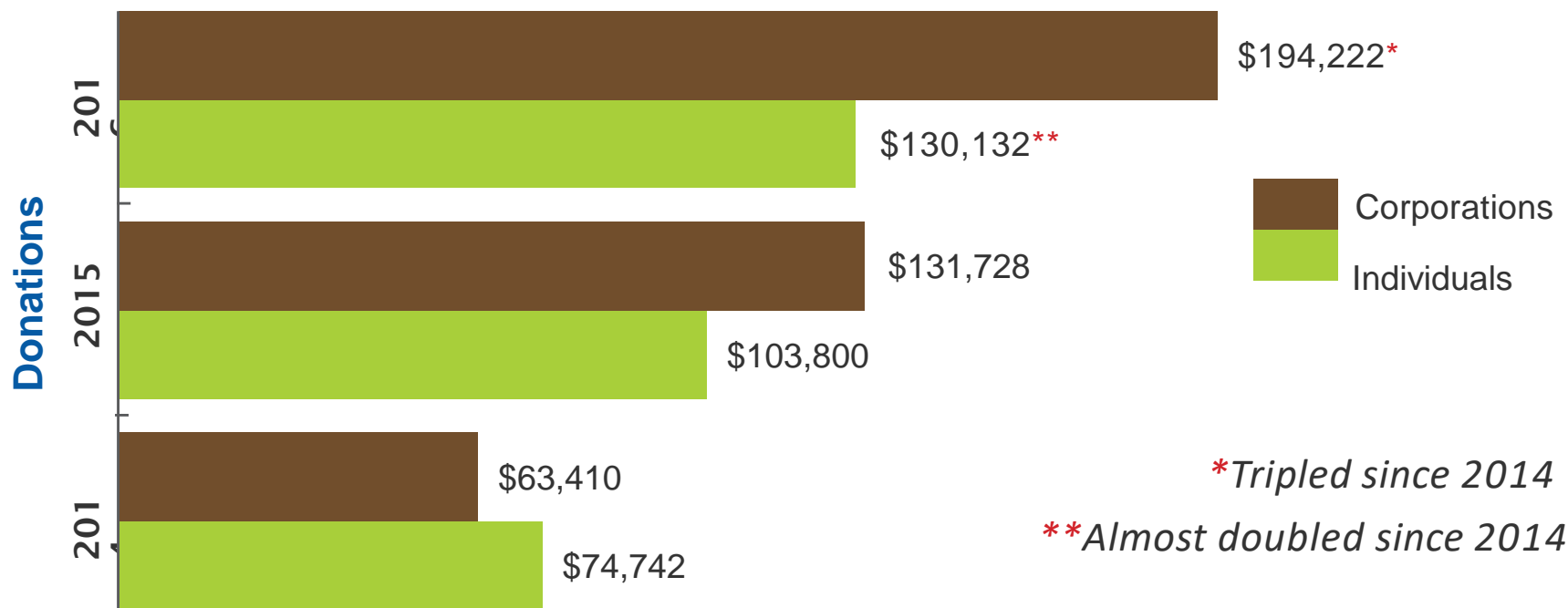

FFY receives the 2016 National Safe Place Network “Model Program Award” in recognition of developing a community collaboration model to bring this runaway prevention program to Columbus

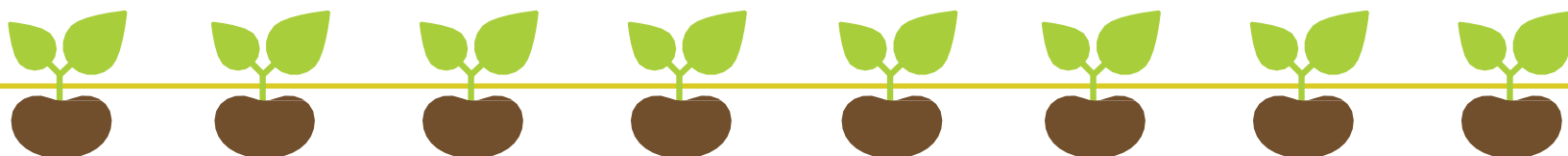


Boys and Girls club Director Nathan Larrison receives the Gateway to Impact award from Jim Clark, CEO BGCA

his Big, Cole:

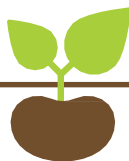


Q: How does it make you feel when Cole comes to see you?

I went to high school at Columbus North and played on the football team during my four years there. As with many team sports, I developed great lifelong friendships with my teammates. One of my teammates in the senior class named Jowan Gill, was currently involved with Big Brothers Big Sisters and frequently advocated for other's to join the program. Since then, the idea of joining BBBS has always stuck with me through my years at Purdue, but I never acted on it until joining Cummins Inc. in 2014. I attended a BBBS call-out meeting at Cummins where Bigs went around the room and shared their stories, experiences, and what being a Big has meant to them; after the meeting I quickly started the application process.

After finishing up with the application process, in 2015 I was lucky enough to be matched with my Little B, Charlie. Charlie and I started in the school based program where I spent my lunch hour once per week with him at his school. Our friendship quickly developed and I could tell he was always excited to see me on my days with him. As we became closer friends, we both thought it would be cool to hangout outside of school, so we moved to a community & school based program. After

moving to the community based program, Charlie and I were able to repair and race my nitro RCcar, ride bikes, work on his homework the library, and go bowling. Over the past year and a half, Charlie and I have really grown in our friendship as well as individually.

Perhaps the best way to describe what being a Big means to me is to revisit myself at Charlie's age and remember who I looked up to, why, and if they were really an exemplary idol or not. I learnt many things from who I looked up to, everything from good qualities and characteristics I wanted to resemble to finding out that the 'cool' kids can be very far from cool. For me, being a Big is not just for my own personal growth but to share what I have learned from my past experiences and to apply this to be the best mentor I can be for Charlie. So one day when he takes a moment to reflect back on himself, he remembers me as one of his good guys he looked up to that had a positive impact on his life.

Q: What do you like best about being part of Big Brothers Big Sisters?

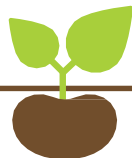
I like that I get away from all the stress in my life and I just go have fun.

I applied and my first match, Lindsey Taylor, was my little sis. We got along great and had a lot of great times together. She is now married but we still keep in touch and visit each other fairly often.

Once Lindsey graduated, I wasn't 100% sure that I was going to do another match, but I'm glad I did. Serena was really needing someone and Barb thought I fit the bill. We get along great and We like to do the same things (cook, crafts, paint, bake). She knows that she can count on me to be there for her and encourage her when needed and also to counsel her when things aren't going perfect for her. Im hoping that we can continue until she graduates and then who knows, maybe I'll take on a third little sis.
